Hence, it was also decided that the SHGs will be trained by RMC under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Rural Livelihood Mission.

I had never thought I will be an auto driver," says Laxmi. But her confidence on the road hardly would make you think so. When Laxmi Nay-ak decided to become an e-auto rick-shaw driver outple of months ago, her family and neighbours were doubful that "a woman can drive" an that 'a woman can drive' an

women autorickshaw drivers in Bourkela-Smart City, under the Pink Autoproject launched by Bourkela Municipal Corporation (EMC) and Rourkela

After scrutiny of documents, free driving training of 90 days was provided to 31 beneficiaries at seven different loca-tions of Rourkels. Learner's Licence was issued to 67 beneficiaries, out of which 48 beneficiaries applied for Pink Auto loan throughurban liveli-bood scheme.
